ESSENTIAL CARE GUIDELINES

ESSENTIAL VISITS MAY INCLUDE: Medical visits related to systemic and ocular disease, as well as visits in which the patients complain of blurry vision, change in vision, vision discomfort and other symptoms that interfere with or significantly hamper their day to day activity. Added consideration could be someone who loses or breaks their glasses and have no other pair. It is important to triage every schedule appointment.

ESSTENTIAL EXAMPLES

PAIN, REDNESS, SENSITIVITY TO LIGHT	 Conjunctivitis has presumed links to COVID-19 patients Acute or dull; in or around eye, may or may not inclue: trauma, vision loss, discharge May or may not wear contact lenses
NO CURRENT VISION SOLUTIONS	 Patient has lost or broken their only pair of functional glasses, or is out of contact lenses without a back-up pair of glasses
CONTACT LENS-RELATED; URGENT	 Pain, redness, discharge, sensitivity to light, sudden discomfort
VISION LOSS	 Acute or gradual with or without pain, sudden onset blurry visior color desaturation
HALOS AROUND LIGHTS	Acute or sudden; may or may not have painful browPatient over 40
FLASHES OR FLOATERS	 Acute; one eye or both; with or without loss of vision; with or without pain
DOUBLE VISION	Acute; one or both eyes
DROOPING OF EYELID	Acute or sudden
TRAUMA	Blunt force or projectile; foreign body in eye, chemical burn

ANNUAL EXAMS

Annual exams can be both essential and non-essential depending on the patient's eye health histo

ESSENTIAL

- Not all annual exams are routine
- Essential visits include medical visits related to systemic and occular disease; as well as visits in which patients complain discomfort and other symptoms that interfere with or significantly hamper their day to day funtions.

NON-ESSENTIAL

• Routine comprehensive eye exam
